

Service and Support Administration & Waiver Services



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Service and Support Administration (SSA) provides services to children (age 3 and above) and adults with developmental disabilities, their families, and guardians by supporting them to choose goals and/or services to help them be successful. The SSA serves as the individual's single point of accountability by providing service coordination with several community agencies and across several systems. Individual choice is what drives the entire process including eligibility, assessments, Individual Service Plan (ISP) development, budgets for services, provider selection, quality assurance reviews, designation of a daily representative, monitoring of all services, and emergency interventions.

SSAs also assist individuals with developmental disabilities to maintain living in their communities through assistance of waiver services, supported living, and respite services. The services range from drop in services to 24 hour care. These services can be funded through Family Resources, Supported Living Services, or Medicaid funded Level One and Individual Options Waivers. Currently, the board serves 4 individuals on Supported Living, 36 on Level One Waivers, and 57 on Individual Options Waivers.

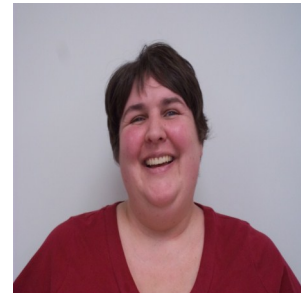
In addition to these services, since 1992, the Board purchased 5 homes in Byesville and Cambridge with the assistance of Capital Housing dollars to provide housing with reduced rent to individuals with developmental disabilities and their families.



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
